**Shimla, August 5, 2021:** As part of its wide-ranging, empathetic response to the COVID-19 crisis, the Mahindra Group today donated five ambulances to the Government of Himachal Pradesh. The ambulances are fitted with oxygen cylinders with the aim to support hospitals in Shimla, Solan, Mandi, Kinnaur and Kangra districts. In addition, Club Mahindra Naldhera resort was converted into a quarantine centre for exclusive use by the Government of HP in the first wave. It has donated face shields, ration kits, PPE kits and refreshments on 24 check-posts across Shimla and Solan districts.
