




- The Welding industry suffers from a chronic shortage of adequately skilled manpower required to power this engine of growth.



Structured and semi-structured questionnaires, and KIIs were used to collect quantitative data and qualitative data.




Research Findings (1/2)





IRECS Evaluation

The overall impact assessment findings may be mapped as per the criteria of the IRECS framework as follows:

Inclusiveness

The project focuses on providing vocational skilling and certification to candidates from socio-economically weak background. The selection process does not request for any pre-requisite skills apart for the minimum level of education and age limit. In the sample covered, candidates are between 18 to 35 years of age, more than 53% candidates have HSC level, 20 % SSC & 15 % Graduation.



Relevance

The project is highly relevant considering skills training provided at centres and available jobs as more than 96% candidates have received placement opportunities indicating huge market relevance and demand for vocational training.

Sustainability

The alumni growth showcased through the project has been able to motivate candidates to participate in the programme sustain the impact of Pratham Foundation.

Convergence

Convergence is an integral part of this skilling project as the programmes are affiliated Government of India with certifications and is aligned to courses under the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) through its nodal agency i.e National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) and Sector Skill Council norms.

Effectiveness

The project has effectively reached more than 450 candidates from underprivileged section in Mohali and Nashik.

More than 87% candidates are satisfied with their current income with 40% earning more than INR 12,000 monthly & 50% in range of INR 8,000 to INR 12,000.
